## —DALYAN & CAUNOS—

The ancient city of Caunos lies here with its ruins dating back to the 3rd Century. The Dalyan channel through which water circulates between the Mediterranean and Koycegiz Lake winds its way down past the ancient Rock Tombs to the sea, via a small network of lakes and waterways.

Through the rustling reed beds rising between 3 and 5 metres in height. With its mixture of fresh and salt water, these wetlands are now home to a vast number of fish and other water life, as well as the birds of many species which feed on them, species such as the Sparrow hawk, Crane, Kingfisher and Jay.



Dividing the delta is the Iztuzu sandbar stretching for 5 km east from the south of the channel. With fine crystal sand, shallow turquoise sea Iztuzu beach is the ideal seaside spot.

The ancient city of Caunos lies here with its ruins dating back to the B.C. Caunos, the son of Miletos, had been indicated as the founder of the city and therefore, it had been named Caunos. The city was first captured by the Persians and then by Alexander and in the year 189 B.C., it was made subject to the Kingdom of Rhodes.



Also the mud bath with can be visited while you are visiting the Dalyan. Thermal waters spring up at many places. The hot sulphurous waters are credited with healing rheumatic and skin diseases as well as other cases. Lunch served at riverside restaurants with the view of Rock Tombs from local dishes.

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Tours starts from Top Yacht Gocek Base and may be finished at Dalaman Airport, tours escorted by official tour guide includes; transfers with a/c vehicles, entrance fees, lunch excl. drinks.
